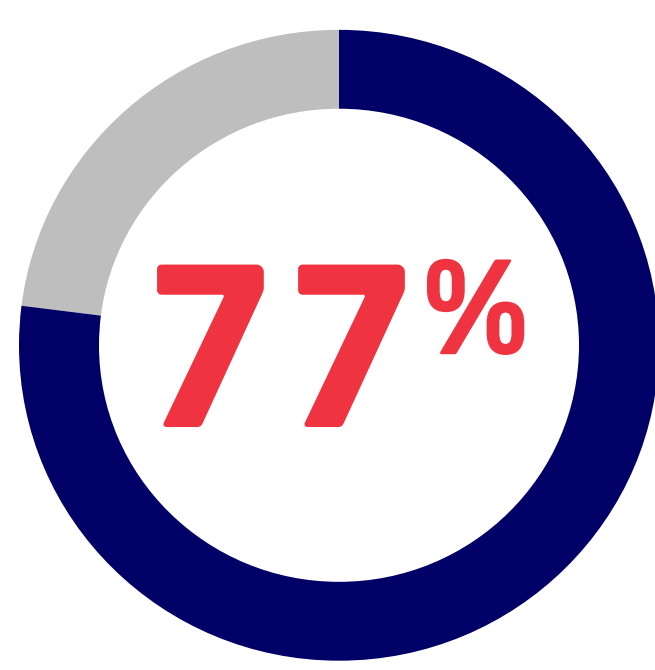


State of RANSOMWARE Readiness 2022

We're in the throes of a cybersecurity crisis - and it's only getting worse.

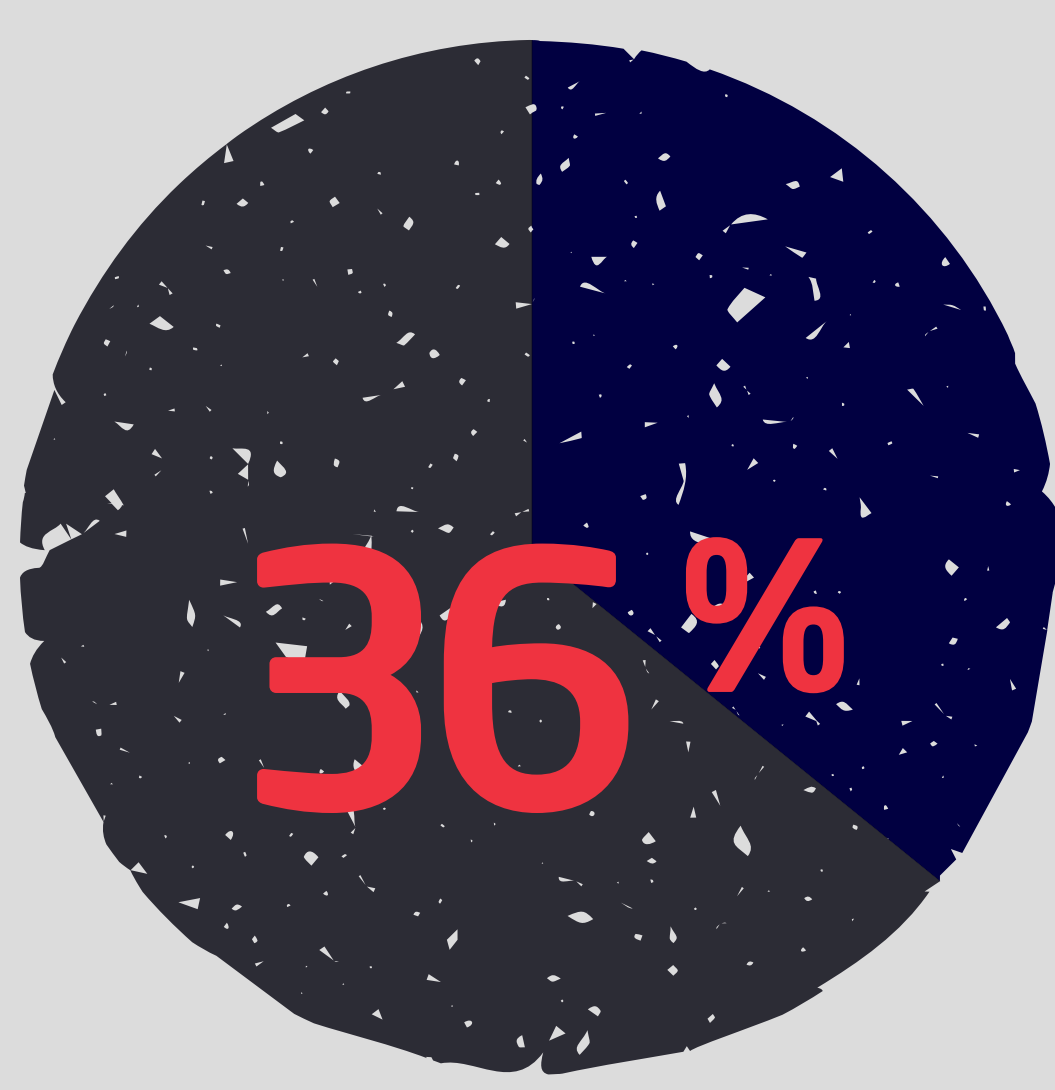
Key Findings



Leaders of companies have been bombarded by more or the same number of cyberattacks in 2022 as there were last year



Leaders who anticipate a ransomware attack will bring down a critical piece of national infrastructure - e.g., a utility company, bank, or transportation network - within the next two years



Cybersecurity leaders who lost confidence in their cyber insurance



Cybersecurity leaders who felt personally responsible for a breach in 2021



Leaders who've retained that same sense of culpability in 2022, pointing to the rapidly declining sense of accountability when it comes to successful cyberattacks
